

BS in ECON Comparison with BS in IA (Int Econ Concentration)

For students majoring in International Affairs (BS) with International Economics Concentration, only one additional class is needed to complete a double major in ECON (BS) and no additional classes necessary to complete a minor in ECON.

For students majoring in International Affairs (BS) with other concentrations, up to 5 additional classes may be necessary to complete a double major in ECON (BS). Actual number of additional classes will vary depending on the concentration and classes chosen to satisfy IA general/major requirements.
